CARTHAGE VETERINARIAN AWARDED FOR CAREER ACHIEVEMENT

AUSTIN, March 19, 2008—State leaders in veterinary medicine honored Carthage area veterinarian, Dr. J. Wayne Kyle, March 2 at the Texas Veterinary Medical Association (TVMA) Annual Conference in College Station, TX. Dr. Kyle was nominated and selected by colleagues to receive the 2008 TVMA Distinguished Veterinary Career Achievement Award, an honor of high credibility among veterinary professionals.

Given annually by TVMA, this award serves to recognize outstanding professional performance across a full career in veterinary practice and to celebrate outstanding achievement attained over an extended career in veterinary medicine.

Dr. Kyle’s career as a practicing veterinarian spanned a period of 50 years, and he recently retired after 45 years of mixed animal practice in Carthage.
